We are excited to invite you to this year's experiment in creating loving community. This year we're planning a Camp that includes plenty of time for play, relaxation, cuddling and reflection in the midst of several new exciting workshop presentations. As you can see from our schedule, we are planning more Forums and Gender Circles than last year to give some structure to more relaxed days in between workshops.

Network for a New Culture (NFNC) is dedicated to creating a world without fear or violence, by promoting self-awareness and personal empowerment. We believe that these goals are most effectively achieved in the context of a supportive and loving community. One of the primary purposes of Summer Camp is to create such a community as a vehicle for social change, and to serve as a model for participants to emulate. The New Culture Institute (NCI) is a non-profit created to further this work and vision by sponsoring Summer Camp and other projects which share in our vision for a new culture.

An aspect of community involves contribution to support daily activities. We envision all campers participating equally in work shifts, which also provide excellent opportunities to bond, deepen connections, and encourage leadership.

We trust that you will join us in the co-creation of camp this year, as we focus on positive social change, creating community, personal growth, sexual choice, and healing the gender split, in a safe, fun, and nurturing environment. Join us in August for Summer Camp like you've never experienced it before!

Note: If you are a returning Camper, you have probably noticed that Camp is two days shorter this year; all Campers are invited to come a day early or stay a day later if you are willing to help us set up or put away Camp on those days.

Important Details to Know

When: Sunday, August 6th through Friday, August 18th, 2006.

Where: Near Ruch, Oregon (45- 60 minutes west of Ashland or Medford, OR)

Shared Chores – All campers will be asked to contribute 7-8 hours per week to make camp run smoothly. This can include cooking or cleaning in the kitchen, straightening up shared spaces, helping with the children's program, or other camp chores. This is an opportunity to bond more deeply with each other as we share in the work of making camp happen.

Clothing is optional throughout most areas of camp.

Weather: Every kind of weather is possible, from HOT to COLD, and WET to DRY. August is typically changeable.

We provide: Campsites, healthy vegetarian, vegan, and raw meals, unisex outdoor showers, 12 days of exciting programs, guest speakers, experiential workshops and activities, and a snack kitchen for preparing your personal snacks and meal supplements.

Essentials: A flashlight, tent, sleeping bag and pad, extra blankets for cold nights, sunscreen, sunglasses, summer clothes for hot days, warm clothes for possible cold weather, easy to carry water bottle, personal back jack or chair, spray bottle for hot days, and a few gallons of water to keep at your tent.

Meat policy: Our hosts have asked us not to cook meat anywhere on the property. Prepared meat will be allowed in personal RV campers on-site. Dried meat (jerky or dehydrated meat) will be allowed outdoors on-site, and may be stored in the personal foods kitchen. If this year's policy is a hardship for you, please contact us, and we will be happy to work with you to find solutions that meet both your needs and the policies of our host.

Optional Items: A creative donation for the auction, water toys for swimming, fun and outrageous clothing and costumes for dressing up and dance parties.

Leave at Home: Alcohol or recreational drugs, valuables of any sort, pets of any make or size.

Auction: Get ready to be amused and surprised by the variety of unusual services donated by fellow campers. Previous auctions have included such offerings as 1000 kisses, a morning serenade with toast and beverage to your liking, an oil wrestling match, a week-long time share in Hawaii, and many others. Auction proceeds support our scholarship program.

Participatory Music: All music-making is greatly appreciated. Bring instruments and talents. Be part of the live music celebration and share your music.

RVs: There are limited RV parking sites. There are no hook-ups available. Prior notice is required for RVs.

Caveat: Besides being a wonderful escape from some of society's repressive social constraints, Summer Camp can be an intense personal and interpersonal experience. As such, it offers opportunities and challenges to face our own innermost inconsistencies, insecurities, and instabilities, and to encounter and respond to those of others. Be aware that not every situation at Summer Camp may be to your liking, and that you are always at choice to participate or not.

Traditionally, many campers practice multiple loving committed relationships. However, Summer Camp is a place where all relationship choices are honored and represented.
